Ashley Smith Thomas is the Founder & CEO of Freedom's Fund USA, a nonprofit to protect freedom and national security. She is an Academy Fellow at the Heritage Foundation, based in Washington, D.C.

Ashley started her career as the Assistant to the Vice President of Corporate Development for The Blaze in Dallas. She made a corporate move to manage a \$14.7M project to rescue and resettle persecuted Christians and religious minorities who were targeted by ISIS in 2016. Ashley and her team rescued over 1,000 families and resettled them to host countries around the world. Upon accomplishing the project's goals, Ashley was contracted by a company in 2018, to develop resettlement opportunities for recovered victims targeted by a terrorist organization in Africa.

Ashley furthered her calling by starting her own organization to work alongside the private and public sector to protect freedom. She works toward countering religious persecution, human trafficking, extremism, and other threats to freedom in America and around the globe. She has briefed and continues to brief panels within the intelligence community.

In 2013, Ashley graduated Magna Cum Laude from Oral Roberts University with her Bachelors in Communication and Government with the concentration in Politics. While attending undergrad, Ashley worked for a United States Congressman and was 1 of 30 young women chosen to participate in the National Education for Women's Leadership Institute held at the University of Oklahoma in 2013. In 2018, she went on to receive her Juris Masters in International Law from Liberty University School of Law. Ashley has earned professional certificates in Project Management and U.S. Intelligence Analysis from SMU.

Ashley and her husband reside in Texas, as they continue to be a voice for freedom and protect national security from threats domestic and abroad.

Legislatively Speaking . . .

Quorum, Voter Integrity, New RPT Chairman, Fort Bend County Sending Democrat Consultant Door-to-Door to the Unvaccinated

There is a lot to discuss in this month's legislative update. I am sure you are getting tired of hearing about the Democrats that bailed, left their job to run to the big D in the sky, Washington D.C. They have had plenty of TV attention. The comments by their adoring fans get more distorted by the hour. You might find this bit of information amusing: One complaint is the Texas bill does not allow enough time for voting. They are demanding 24hour voting. Per the 7/16 Election Integrity call, the Secretary of State reported the only instance of 24hour voting in the history of Texas was by one county (Harris) in one election (2020). Dems are using this quorum stunt for fundraising. Reportedly Beto O'Rourke has raised a large sum and entertainers are also donating to the runaways. It looks like they will be supported for now. You can find a list of the absent Dems in the 7/13 issue of the "Texas Minute". -- Democrats Bust Quorum in the Texas House Just as Special Session Gets Underway | Texas Scorecard. I counted eleven with committee chairmanships and several vice chairs in the group. In other areas of service this would be called dereliction of duty but, apparently not for them. There are questions about retributions. Apparently, there are some, but nothing can be done while they are out of the state. The Speaker of the House did remove the Rep. Joe Moody (D) El Paso from the Speaker Pro Tempore position.

Rep. Andy Murr (R) HD53, who authored HB 3 Election Integrity and Security bill, attended Toni Anne's 7/16 call. He made excellent points about correcting narrative about HB 3 as needed on the spot. We can all help out with that. He believes the Democratic Party is using the quorum incident to push a broader national agenda without knowing what is in the Texas bill. Rep. Murr wrote an op ed that was published in the 7/16 Houston Chronicle. I encourage you to read it for yourself.

Special Session - Election Security (mailchi.mp)

In other business, Matt Renaldi was elected Chairman of the Republican Party of Texas, replacing Alan West after his resignation. Matt has a reputation of being a strong Republican with expertise in fundraising. As an attorney and Representative for HD115 (Dallas Co.),

Fort Bend County to share private health information with Democrat consulting group to go door-to-door to the homes of unvaccinated; to pay up to \$345,000 of taxpayer money

This last issue should make you very nervous. This story takes place in Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County, Texas. The makeup of the court is three Democrats and two Republicans.

A clerk working in the elections office accidentally found out that the commissioners planned to hire a Democratic consulting firm to go door to door to interview citizens who have not been vaccinated. The County plans to release vaccination records to the firm. Rep. Jacey Jetton, whose district includes Fort Bend County says the vaccination rate is fairly high there, with 80% of those over 65 having been vaccinated. Why was this necessary? It all came together in secret without any public discussion. The Commissioners Court authorized up to \$345,000 dollars of taxpayer money for the project, much being FEMA funds. No one needs to be told the FEMA funds are to help communities and citizens in case of disaster, not to pay off Democratic hacks. Word got into the community. Hundreds of people showed up to protest the vote. They filled the building and spilled outside continuing the protest. It made no difference; the vote carried. This is all the detail that was given and we do not know how this is going to work. Thankfully, we know about this now and it is a big lesson for all of us. In her new book, The Mind of a Conservative Woman. Marsha Blackburn discusses how Democrats are manipulating small communities. She writes we have been looking at it all along but not seeing the damage. They choose issues and language carefully, then pick vulnerable communities where there will likely be little push back to move their agenda "inch by inch and policy by policy". Their strategy is to grow government quietly without policy arguments or attention from the press. This process repeats itself at all levels of government from federal down to the smallest local communities. It seems harmless enough but it is not! It is a big takeover attempt without a hassle for the Democrats.

Fort Bend County residents found out too late to stop this move due to the secrecy of the planners. They now are developing grassroots watchdog groups to monitor and report on all meetings held by local elected officials such as, Commissioners Court, City Council and school board or any meeting that involves county policy.

Even though Cooke County is deeply red, we cannot take for granted that the same thing cannot happen here, because it can. The Democratic party has been open about their intent to turn Texas blue. We cannot let that happen. We can form watchdog groups to monitor all meetings and then report to the community.

Toni Anne pointed out the importance of forming relationships with other citizens who attend these meetings and of sharing information. The 7/16 video is posted here <u>TAD for Election Reform — Toni Anne Dashiell RNC National Committeewoman for Texas</u> Take a few minutes to watch and listen. I think you will find it very informative. Please note the call to action: 1) Be armed with facts, speak out boldly when you hear incorrect statements. 2) Consider forming watchdog groups to monitor local meeting and remain knowledgeable. Share the information.
