chair@cookegop.com. Your name will be put on a list with the PC materials. But remember: If no one shows up for the PC, no one will be elected as a delegate, and your precinct will have no representation at the County Convention.

Unfortunately, many of our precincts have no Precinct Chairman, so be sure to arrange for someone—a friend or relative or neighbor to be there. They shouldn't be afraid: 1) We provide a script and everything needed, 2) A person who chairs a PC does not become the Precinct Chair. Their duties end when they turn in the PC packet to me.

## Official List of March Republican Primary Ballot Propositions

The State Republican Executive Committee (SREC) approved placing eleven propositions on the March 6 Primary ballot .... The propositions are non-binding, meaning they do not create laws. However, they are a proven, effective way to poll Republican voters on various issues and inform elected officials on where those voters stand.

RPT Chair James Dickey: "The SREC deliberated and delivered eleven propositions to place on our Primary ballot. We look forward to hearing from our voters on these issues and to sharing the results with lawmakers. Whatever the results, we will continue working towards making our principles a reality."

Here is the full list of ballot propositions submitted by the SREC for inclusion on the 2018 Republican General Primary Election ballot:

## CCRW does not and cannot endorse candidates in a contested Primary

To maintain the integrity of our organization, it is important for ALL MEMBERS to know, respect, and follow our Bylaws, especially those related to CANDIDATE ENDORSEMENTS in contested Republican Primaries and Runoff Elections.

The Club, the Club President, and the Vice President of Campaign Activities cannot endorse any candidate for public office in the upcoming March 6 Primary Election or in the May 22 Primary Runoff Election. There is an exemption that allows a President and VP of Campaign Activities to promote their own candidacy or that of a spouse or family member. However, they cannot endorse in the name of the CCRW or in any way imply that CCRW endorses that candidacy.

Our Club Bylaws mirror those of the Texas Federation of Republican Women in this regard. TFRW *requires* Clubs to include these provisions in the Club Bylaws. This is considered such a critical issue that a Club can be *removed* from the TFRW for a violation of this policy.

All CCRW members—with the exception of the President and VP of Campaign Activities—may support, endorse and work for any candidate of their choice in contested Republican primaries, but they <u>cannot endorse in the name of CCRW</u> or in any way imply that CCRW endorses their candidate.






